What is a conservation area?

A conservation area is designated by the Council because of its important historic buildings and features. It is a way to protect historic areas from harmful change and to encourage good-quality design in new buildings.

What does it mean to me?

Being in a conservation area means that some planning controls are stricter than elsewhere. Buildings in a conservation area are protected from demolition without permission, and any new buildings in a conservation area must meet high standards of design. Trees have a greater degree of protection.

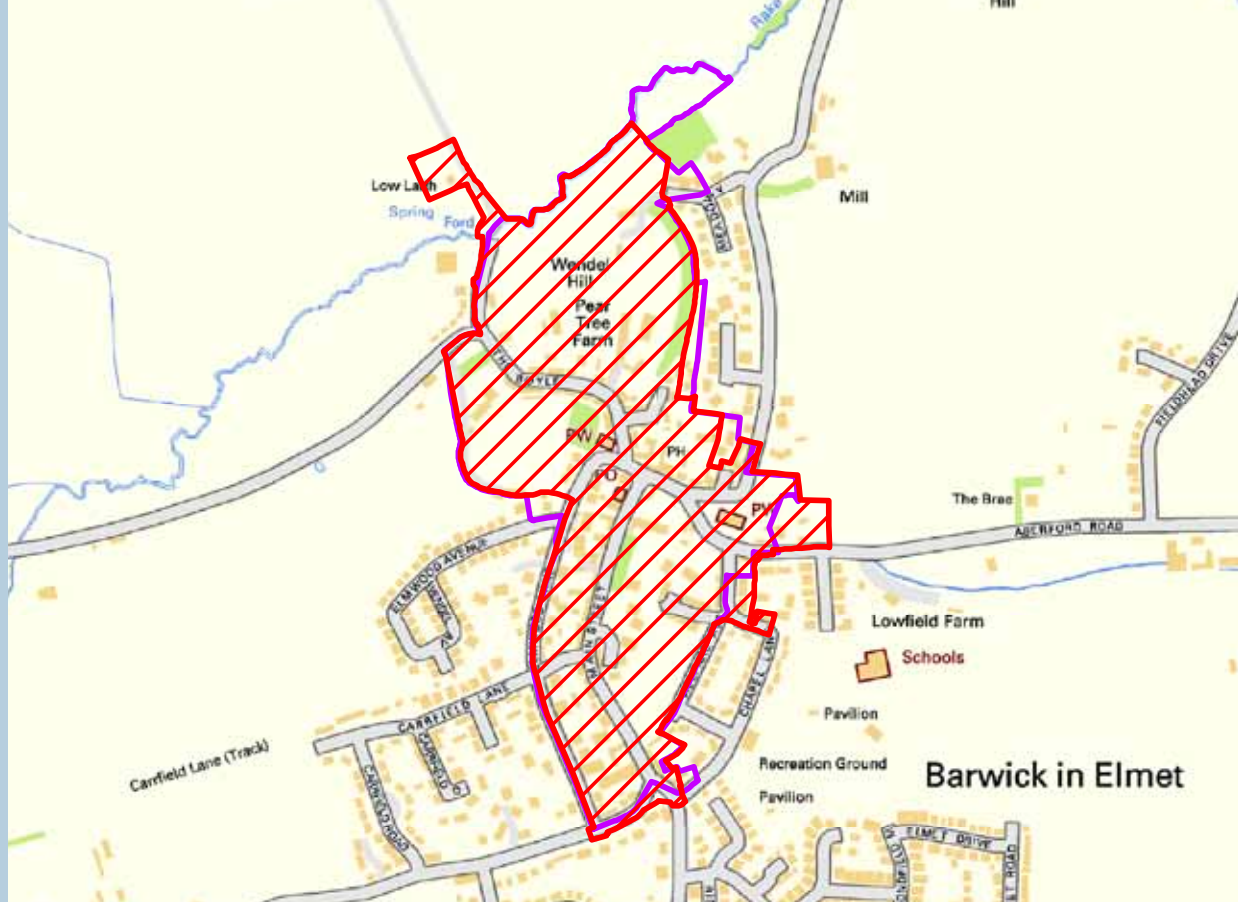
